The [Canadian Centre for Child Protection](#) (Canadian Centre) is a national charity dedicated to the personal safety of all children. Our goal is to reduce the sexual abuse and exploitation of children, assist in the location of missing children, and prevent child victimization through a number of programs, services, and resources for Canadian families, educators, child-serving organizations, law enforcement, and other parties.

The Canadian Centre offers online professional development training, as well as specialized resources for school staff (e.g., teachers, educational assistants, clinicians, counsellors, administrators, ECEs, bus drivers, custodians, etc.).


23 minute Introductory Training: *Commit to Kids — An Introduction to Safeguarding Children from Sexual Abuse* is a short online overview for individuals who work with children and are looking for introductory level information on child sexual abuse, or those looking to refresh their knowledge on the topic. Parents who have children in child-serving organizations may also find the content relevant.

Certificate Training, 2.5 hours, 8 modules: Commit to Kids — Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Training for those Working with Children is an online training for individuals who work or volunteer with children. This training results in a certificate of completion, comes with a downloadable resource guide, and covers the following topics: the definition of child sexual abuse, the grooming process, handling disclosures of child sexual abuse, the impact of child sexual abuse, the importance of professional boundaries, creating a Child Protection Code of Conduct, and policies and procedures to protect children.

Grades: school staff working with all grades and in all positions within the school

Commit to Kids for Coaches Training covers all the same information as *Commit to Kids — Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Training for those Working with Children* but results in both a certificate of completion and three NCCP professional development points towards the maintenance of certification.





Expert Video for Educators or Mental Health Workers is an online video series available to professionals who have completed Commit to Kids — Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Training for those Working with Children training. The video series addresses issues related to child sexual abuse and online exploitation. An expert panel provides information on a range of topics, including child sexual offenders, child sexual abuse imagery, child disclosure and discovery, supporting a child victim, impacts of child sexual abuse, and prevention.




The Teatree Tells Online Training assists early child educators with successful implementation of *Teatree Tells: A Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Kit*.

Type of resource: online professional development

Cost: FREE for early child educators (ECEs) who own or are employed by an entity that owns a copy of *Teatree Tells: A Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Kit*

Grades: school staff working with children in pre-K and kindergarten

DIGITAL RESOURCES THAT INCLUDE ONLINE TRAINING COMPONENTS (which are noted above)

Teatree Tells is a child sexual abuse prevention program designed for children from four to six years of age. Lessons are age appropriate, engaging, and include an animated character, Teatree, who teaches them how to be safe. The program includes printed and digital versions of the *Teatree Tells* lessons and supplementary resources.

Type of resource: lessons for ECEs to use with children — in print and digital formats

Cost: \$45 + taxes and shipping

Grades: school staff working with children in pre-K and kindergarten

Kids in the Know is the Canadian Centre's interactive safety education program designed for students from kindergarten to high school. The program engages students with interactive activities to help build skills that increase their personal safety and reduce their risk of victimization online and offline. Lessons in *Kids in the Know* are matched to [curricula outcomes](#) in all provinces and territories in Canada. The program includes print and digital versions of the *Kids in the Know* lessons and supplementary resources.



RESOURCES (order print copies online)

Resource Guide for Schools: Addressing Self/Peer Exploitation is a printed resource to help educate school personnel about the issue of self/peer exploitation and offer them a structure and framework on how to respond if a self/peer exploitation incident does occur with students in their school. The resource guide also discusses how to minimize the circulation of the image/video in question, as well as how to appropriately respond to the harmful impact these incidents can have upon the affected youth as well as the school and community at-large. A resource guide for families is also available.

To purchase the online training at the discounted rate, follow these steps:

1. Visit <https://vta.c3p.ca/app/en/checkout>
2. Select the training titled **Commit to Kids — Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Training for those Working with Children** and select the quantity you want to purchase.
3. At the top of the screen, enter promo code **CDNSchools** and click **Submit Code**.
Note: promo code is case specific.
4. Complete billing information at the bottom of the screen. Be sure to list your school and division name in the field of **School / Organization**.

Once your purchase is complete, you will be provided access to the training within two business days, unless circumstances change due to ongoing challenges related to COVID-19.

*\$7 rate is available from March 25, 2020 – June 30, 2020. Use of promotional code **CDNSchools** is required at time of purchase to qualify for the reduced rate.
